#### **NEWS FROM THE CITY OF MIAM!**

Tomas Regalado is the new City Manager, and City Manager Carlos Migoya, a career banker who has taken on Miami widening financial woes. His priorities as City Manager is to help Miami avert financial disaster, though he would not commit a lengthy stay, Migoya said he will not leave until finances are in order. He will forgo salary and benefits of more than \$300,000 a year and bawing to evaluate every department and employees. This is not a one year problem.

Mayor Regalado said he and Migoya will focus on the unions whose worker-friendly contracts have helped strangle the City purse strings. These contracts have been approved by all commissioner including Regalado. The Mayor is telling the unions that they will not be adversaries, they will clean the house first and then they will approach the unions. The City is also confronted by a growing federal investigation into the city finances launched by the US Securities and Exchange Commission. Federal regulators have asked Miami to turn over all communications between several department's heads regarding millions of dollars of questionable money transfers and \$250 millions in bonds sold over the past four years.

Just three month after closing a \$118 millions budget hole, commissioners learned revenues remained in such a free fall, the finance director project a new deficit of between \$20 million and \$45 million. Among the assets being considered for sale to raise funds are parking garages and the city owned Knight Center which carries a \$5.5 million debt obligation. Financial projections show the City falling bellow the reserved amount required in the Financial Integrity Ordinance. In that case, staff will have to forward a two year plan to the Commission to replenish the account, which City Manager Migoya said he intents to do.

Throughout the past year there has been considerable discussion between Miami Police FOP, the Miami Association of Fire Fighters and General Employees and the City of Miami on the issues of the City's financial budget crisis, layoffs, contract concessions, pension stabilization, change of the pension actuarial method for determining costs, COLA, and Cola Reserve and unfounded liability. City of Miami is squeezing the unions to cut costs to the City. The City threatened the Unions with layoffs. Both the IAFF and the FOP were able to negotiate concessions that prevented layoffs and did not impact retirees benefits. Mayor Regalado want to work together with all the parties to solve the problem.

At the September 10, 2009, the City Commission voted to direct the City Manager to find the best law firm they could find to attack the Gate Settlement and get rid of it. The City wants to take back control of the FIPO trust. The City want to change the "Actuarial Cost Method" from the "Aggregate Cost Method" to the "Entry Gate Method". This will require a modification of the Gates Lawsuit settlement and would require a reopening of the Gates in the courts.
